Course Description:

Learn some simple and truly effective techniques for printing onto clay using lace, a variety of fabrics and natural materials. You will create textures and patterns in your clay work which you can use to create bespoke plaques, jewellery, bowls and tea-lights. Nik will guide you through each process to enable you to create individual pieces in your own unique style. In the afternoon you can to introduce colour into your work by painting with under glazes. Nik will take the work home to fully dry and fire. Work is generally ready within 2-3 weeks. Complete beginners welcome.

Nik Hunter-Dale works from her home in Levens where she has her own studio. Her work began as a ceramicist, making slab built aesthetically pleasing pieces to wear or for decoration in the home. Since studying Foundation Art at Kendal College (2001) she now aims to combine these aesthetic pieces with more thought-provoking creations. She enjoys working with a wide variety of mediums, as she relishes the challenge of learning new skills that stimulate ideas and fresh creativity. She explores themes such as climate change, physical and mental health and well-being, to encourage thought provoking conversation, with a hope that it might encourage positive change.
