Course Description:

Develop the drawing skills you need to draw animals confidently. The workshop will cover steps on how to draw animals using simple shapes and lines, the concept of gesture drawing and basic animal anatomy. There will be tips and techniques for using reference photographs to produce an animal portrait and advice given for observing and sketching your own pets. Jayne will bring along a range of drawing mediums so there will be plenty of opportunity to try something different and experiment before creating your own finished piece in a medium of your choice

Jayne Lancaster is a graduate of the University of Cumbria with a Foundation Degree in Drawing. Jayne specialises in drawings and illustrations detailing agricultural and rural wildlife taking great inspiration from the farming and countryside environment. As well as private commissions for animal portraits, Jayne exhibits and sells artworks regularly both locally and further afield and has run successful demonstrations, workshops and art courses in animal studies for local art groups. Jayne has participated in a number of community artworks including the Go Herdwick public art trail in the Lake District and creating a large scale mural for the Outward Bound Trust.
